

What to do in the event of an accident

- 1) STOP!** Legally, you must stop if any third party property or person is damaged or injured.
- 2) INJURIES!** If any party is injured as a result of the incident, you must notify the police.
- 3) EXCHANGE DETAILS** Note the name, address, telephone number and registration number of the Third Party(ies) involved. You are legally obliged to give the same information to someone with reasonable grounds for requesting details. If there is more than one third party, record the details on a separate sheet and attach to this form.

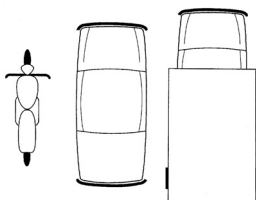

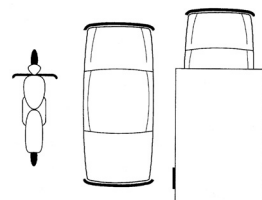
